VARIETY.

A MAMMOTH HOTEL IN NEW YORK.

The New Yorkers are pride themselves upon another hotel, scarcely nearly completed, on the Fifth Avenue, and upon which \$1,441,000 have already been expended.—The following is a brief description of the structure:

The building covers sixteen full lots of six stories high, and has an elec-
tric elevator, the car to the roof of 107
feet, and 100 feet on Fifth Avenue and Broadway together. Twenty-three stories 215
feet in height, the street 100 feet, is capable of accommodating at least 500
guests. There are eight large public par-
lors, 120 private dining rooms, and 400
bedrooms. A large hall was especially
constructed for servants &c. A very elaborate
chandelier hangs above the entrance hall,
the height of the building being 100 feet, and
for which there are over 22 feet of windows
and stairs, not in any other part of the city.
From the top of the steam is reflected all over
the building, a scene of grandeur unequalled
in any other city in the world. The
building stands on a site of 100,000 square
feet, and the circumference is twice a
passage of accident. The grand dining hall
is 50 feet long, 10 feet wide, and 21 feet high,
lighted with eleven elegant chandeliers. The
whole establishment has been leased
for a term of years to Parrot Stevens, Esq.,
proprietor of the Tremont Hotel, Bay
House, Boston, Mass., and will be opened
about the 1st of August.
